

Serging Ahead with your 5-Thread

This class is an advanced serger class designed to take you beyond the basic 4-thread!

I'll also show you a few tips like starting and ending a cover hem stitch in the round and an easy way to deal with the thread tails when you're sewing seams.



Supplies:

- 5-Thread Serger with all accessories
- 5 spools of thread (preferably in colors coordinating with the threading guides on your serger)
- All-purpose needles, EL serger needles, topstitch needles, size 14-16
- 10" squares of muslin to stitch samples
- 1 spool heavy weight topstitching or Pearl Crown Rayon for decorative stitches
- 4 cones serger thread to match tote bag fabric
- 1 yd woven fabric for tote bag (I used linen, fused with lightweight interfacing)
- Fusible interfacing for tote bag fabric if necessary
