# The Moulage Workshop with Kenneth D. King

October 14, 15 and 16, 2011

## Information for the attendees

### Supply List for the workshop

- Drafting ruler–the clear plastic one with 1/8” grid ruled in red is fine
- Drafting square
- French curve
- Pencils–graphite #2, as well as 2 or 3 colored pencils, plus eraser
- Tape measure
- 2 yards elastic, 1/2” wide
- 1 piece of chain, or limp cord for delineating the neck during measuring
- 2 yards muslin, and a 30” separating zipper to make up the pattern, and all your sewing supplies, like scissors and thread
- Dual tracing wheel
- Sewing machine (please let us know if you are unable to bring your sewing machine).

You are required to wear a leotard or other tight- fitting garment, with the desired foundation garments, on Friday (the first day of the class). This facilitates accurate measuring. A Sewing machine is not required on Friday.

\*\*\* Please note: you might want to bring a few side projects to work on in the event of wait time for Kenneth’s individualized measurements and corrections.

## Hours of the workshop

**Friday** 9 am – 5 pm

We will work on our measurements, do the calculations for our draft and will draft the back of the moulage.

**Saturday** 9 am – 5 pm

On the second day, we'll draft the front of the moulage, cut it out in muslin and sew it up. As we make it up, we will start checking the fit.

**Sunday** 9 am – 5 pm

Third day: Finish up on checking the fit of the muslins. We will then cover how to convert the muslins into slopers by adding wearing ease.

**Lunch break** 12:30 – 1:15 every day at Garden Terrace of the Inn

(Your registration fee includes lunch and refreshments all three days)

a “Yankee (Stash) Swap”- a fun way to trade stash. Wrap up 1- 2 yards of some of your stash fabric, bring it to the workshop, and we will trade.

## Getting to Natick, MA



### By Plane

If you're traveling by plane, fly into Boston Logan Airport. The best way to get to the hotel from the airport is to take the Logan Express Bus, which goes almost directly to the hotel. The Hampton Inn provides a free shuttle from the bus depot to the hotel. Here is the link for Logan Express:

The trip takes about 30-45 minutes and costs \$22 for a round trip ticket, \$20 for seniors. The buses run every half hour from 6:30am to midnight. Tickets are purchased on the bus; debit and credit cards are accepted.



### By Train

If you are travelling by train, you will want to take the commuter train on the Framingham/Worcester Line from Boston's South Station to Framingham. The Hampton Inn provides a free shuttle from the train station to the hotel. The train ride is about 40 minutes and costs \$6.00 round trip.
